Membership 2018:

Full members of BAHT are either physiotherapists or occupational therapists who are Health and Care Professionals Council (HCPC) registered. They have full voting rights. Full members are entitled to discounted course rates, to apply for bursaries and research grants and receive a paper copy as well as electronic access to the quarterly Hand Therapy Journal.

New members can join at any time during the membership year (1st February to 31st January); they receive electronic access to previous issues of the journal as well as the voting rights/entitlements relevant to their membership level. On 1st June 2018 the membership numbers were as follows: 278 physiotherapists and 490 occupational therapists.

Overseas members of BAHT are therapists living outside the United Kingdom. They have no voting rights but receive the quarterly journal and are entitled to discounted course



rates. On June 1st 2018 there were 32 overseas members listed on the database.

Student members also have no voting rights; they receive an electronic copy of the journal and are entitled to discounted course rates. There were no student members on 1st June 2018.

Thanks to editorial board members and reviewers for committed time to Journal.

Submissions

Manuscript submissions have increased compared to 2017 however given that we aim to have at least 4 articles (not 3) in each issue and that the submission to acceptance ratio has gone down submission rates need to increase.

Only 1 in 5 submissions comes from the UK which has one of the largest membership bases. Although the acceptance rate is now below 30% which is one of the assessment criteria for indexing on PubMedCentral and Medline it is worth noting that the acceptance rates vary greatly between countries and for UK submission is around 50%
